D/P/S delivered the project with a fast-track approach. Programming for the entire campus was completed concurrently with design of building infrastructure upgrades and final design and construction documents completed immediately afterward. Programming efforts include exploring utilization rates, requests for spaces, and programming work spaces that encourage collaboration and a team environment. The complex phased renovation has been executed in an occupied building constant communication with the owner's team and the CMAR, McCarthy Building Companies.

The team used an innovative approach to document the interior construction through point cloud mapping technology. The CMAR provided estimate updates through the design process, keeping the project within budget. The owner presented the project approach as a Best Practice to the International Facilities Managers Association (IFMA). Through close and constant communication, the owner, design team, and the CMAR have kept the project on schedule and within budget.

All spaces, artwork, colors, and amenities are focused on promoting wellness and comfort for all levels of patient rehabilitation.

The design features rustic materials including stone, glass, and rusted steel - custom gabion, steel and concrete casework, and large bay windows with views to the Grand Canyon. Windows located along the northern edge keep the building cool in hot summer months while letting in plenty of natural light. A shed roof and low to intermediate ceiling heights result in double-curved walls, creating interesting spatial geometries.

A concrete river pattern moves patrons along a cultural walk from the parking lot, through the building, and to the tour buses. Information panels along the path inform visitors about cultural and geographic features of the Grand Canyon and the stretch of the Colorado River that runs through it.

Inside circulation is designed to help large groups quickly access amenities and make purchases. Visitors can catch views of the Grand Canyon, visit the gift shop, and buy food. A large Colorado River scene near the restroom lobby and a giant Grand Canyon panorama behind the sales counter welcome visitors to the park.

The building is designed radially for possible future expansion. The project is expected to break ground by early 2018.
