

The Gold Spot Marketing Center historic restoration revitalized a key corner of the City of Phoenix Roosevelt Historic District, and subsequently helped preserve an important part of its neighborhood fabric. Constructed in 1925 and listed on the National Register of Historic Places, the building
						was one of the first shopping centers in Phoenix to serve a residential area. For over 20 years, the once-vibrant commercial center stood vacant and in disrepair. 
